Ordinance # 14

OFF-ROAD RECREATIONAL VEHICLE ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ALGER PURSUANT TO 1975 PA 319, SECTION 18, AS AMENDED BY 1986 PA 112, FOR THE REGULATION OF PLACE OF OPERATION OF OFF-ROAD RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE.

THE COUNTY OF ALGER HEREBY ORDAINS:

- SECTION 1. As used in this Ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:
 - a. "Highway" means the entire width between the boundary lines of a way publicly maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel, including the shoulder and right-of-way.
 - b. "Operate" means to ride in or on, and be in actual control of the operation of an ORV.
 - c. "ORV" or "vehicle" means a motor driven off-road recreational vehicle capable of cross-country travel without benefit of a road or trail, on or immediately over land, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain. It includes, but is not limited to a multi-track or multi-wheel drive or low pressure tire vehicle, an amphibious machine, a ground effect air cushioned vehicle, or other means of transportation deriving motor power from a source other than muscle or wind. "ORV" or "vehicle" does not include a registered snowmobile, a farm vehicle being used for farming, a vehicle used for military, fire, emergency, or law enforcement purposes, a construction or logging vehicle used in performance of its common function, or a registered aircraft.
 - d. "Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designated, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, and does not include within its meaning the shoulder or right-of-way.
 - e. "Shoulder" means that portion of the highway contiguous to the roadway generally extending the contour of the roadway, not designed for vehicular travel, but maintained for the temporary accommodation of disabled or stopped vehicles otherwise permitted on the roadway.
 - f. "Ditch slope" is that portion of the highway adjacent to the - Page 1 of 3 Pages -

shoulder if one exists or adjacent to the roadway on roads without shoulders, extending to the bottom of the roadside ditch and is not constructed or maintained for the use of any vehicles except those engaged in construction or maintenance.

- g. "Right-of-way" means the portion of the highway immediately to the right and adjacent to the shoulder.
- SECTION 2. An ORV may be operated on the shoulder or on the right-of-way, but not on the roadway of the following public highways within the County of Alger, herein designated as ORV area access routes: County Highway H-01/Rock River Road, Sundell Road, Deerton-Onota Road, AuTrain-Onota Road, Deerton-Sand Lake Road, Peter White Road, Onota Hill Road, Ridge Road, Traunik-Kiva Road, Coaster Road, Matekel Road, Trout Lake Road, County Road H-05/Rapid River Truck Trail Road, County Road H-44, Indiantown Road, Connors Road, a portion of County Road H-58 between the Munising City Limits and the intersection of the Beaver Meadow Road, Beaver Meadow Road, and Adams Trail.
- SECTION 3. Operation of an ORV on the of highways not designated in Section 2 is only permitted under the following conditions:
 - a. In a life-threatening emergency.
 - b. For the purpose of getting from one area to another, an operator may cross such highways at right angles. The operator shall bring the ORV to a complete stop prior to crossing the highway, and shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicle traffic.
- SECTION 4. ORVs being operated on a road shoulder or right-of-way pursuant to Section 2 shall at all times be operated in single file with the flow of traffic at the right side of the right-of-way or right shoulder or the right side of the unimproved road surface when no shoulder or passable clear right-of-way exists. The operator of an ORV shall only be permitted to utilize the access routes designated in Section 2 for the purpose of traveling to or from areas wherein ORV use is lawfully permitted.
- SECTION 5. ORVs may not be operated:
 - a. On the ditch slopes of county roads.
 - b. Within county owned parks, natural areas, airports, or cemetery properties within Alger County.
 - c. Areas closed to snowmobiling.
 - d. In any other area closed by a governmental authority.

- e. On any other county highway not specifically designated with this ordinance.
- f. On U.S. Highway, State Highways, or highways within incorporation cities or villages.
- g. At a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour on any county road, shoulder, or any right-of-way, pursuant to Section 2 or 4 of this ordinance.
- **SECTION 6.** Any person who violates this Ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.
- SECTION 7. The Alger County Board of Commissioners may rescind ORV operation on any county road or portion thereof.

The County Clerk for the County of Alger shall publish this Ordinance in the manner required by law and shall at the same time publish the fact that complete copies of the Ordinance as hereby approved are available at the Office of the Clerk for inspection by and distribution to the Public at all times.

Any Ordinance or part of Ordinances in conflict herewith are subordinate hereto and this Ordinance shall be deemed controlling.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the publication of this notice of adoption, as it affects the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the County of Alger.
